These students applied through their high school counselors and were selected by the Foundation's Scholarship Committee. These scholarships honor and memorialize the brave men and women who served their country and we are grateful to our donors who make these scholarships possible.



Kathleen is the recipient of a Nebraskans of World War II scholarship in the amount of \$2,000. She graduated from Daniel J. Gross Catholic High School in Omaha with a 4.22 GPA and will be attending University of Mary in Bismark, ND in the Fall.

Kale will also be receiving a \$2,000 Nebraskans of World War II Scholarship when he attends North Dakota State University this Fall. He graduated from Central City High School with a 4.0 GPA.



Colton is from Brule, NE and achieved a 3.9884 GPA at South Platte Schools. He will use his \$2,000 Nebraskans in World War II Scholarship at South Dakota School of Mines & Technology.

Ava is from Bellevue, NE and graduated from Duchesne Academy with a 4.0 GPA. She is planning to attend the University of Nebraska at Lincoln in the Fall with a \$500 Pearl Harbor Remembrance Award.



Carly is from Gothenburg, NE and graduated with a GPA of 4.0. She is receiving the \$500 Pearl Harbor Remembrance Award and will be attending the University of Nebraska at Kearney this Fall.

The Nebraskans in World War II Scholarship fund was established through a gift from the family of GM1c Edward Clough. Clough was killed during the attack on Pearl Harbor on December 7, 1941 and remains entombed aboard the U.S.S. Arizona. His sister, Helen, chose to honor his memory through this generous gift. Another Nebraska serviceman, Lt. Adrian DePutron, who was killed during the Battle of the Bulge on January 20, 1945, while serving in General Patton's Third Army, was honored by his aunt, Marjorie Barstow, through her estate with a gift to help enhance the scholarship program.

Pershing Mural Project



RESTORATION OF THE PERSHING MURAL

Since March 1, 2022, and with a goal of raising \$3 million, the Committee to Save the Pershing Mural has received contributions from over 320 individuals, ranging from \$5 - \$1,000, totaling almost \$40,000. In addition to these donations, the Committee has received additional monetary commitments from several entities, including the Acklie Charitable Foundation, Ameritas, the Krieger Foundation, and more totaling over \$470,000.

The Goal is to raise the first million dollars by May 15, 2022. That amount would allow the safe removal of the Mural before the building is roped off for its scheduled demolition late summer. After May 15th, the Committee would have additional time to continue their fundraising and grant-writing efforts to raise the additional \$2 million to restore and reinstall the mural at the Lancaster Event Center.

The NSHSF is serving as fiscal sponsor for donations received for the project. Please consider donating to this important project.

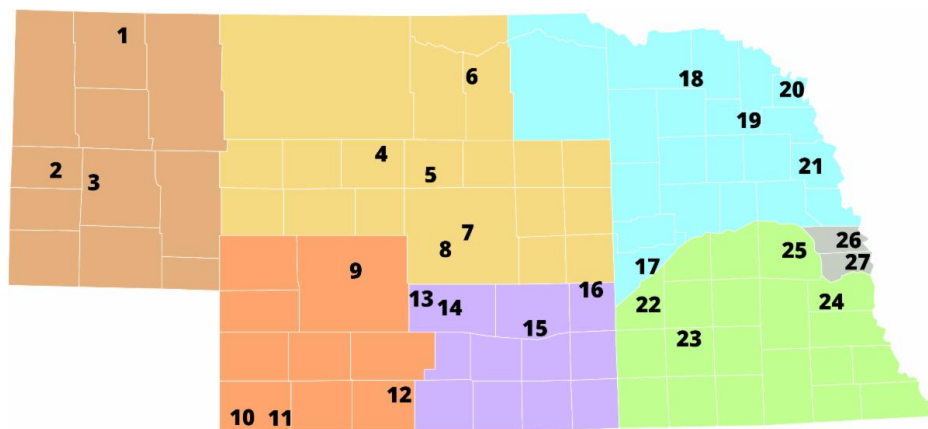
