








Pershing Mural Restoration Update



In a matter of days, scaffolding will be placed in front of Pershing Auditorium and the 2-month process to safely remove the Mural will begin. Although The Committee to Save the Pershing Mural was \$35,000 short of the Phase I goal to raise \$1 million by the end of May, Mike McCullough, from MTZ Properties, has initiated the paperwork and plans to begin removal of the 730,000 tiles in early July.

The Committee plans to raise the rest of the funds needed for Phase II, \$1.8 million, by the end of the summer and find a new location for the mural. This new location will include a new, modern podium with improved vistas and access points.

The Genoa Historical Museum was established in the 1970's when the old Genoa Bank was donated to the City of Genoa as a museum. Allen Atkins was instrumental in establishing the present day exhibits. Among the many exhibits are Allen Atkins' Pawnee Artifacts collection, George Umbarger's collection of Arrowheads and Pottery, Henry Hudson's diary (one of the founders of Genoa), and numerous pictures and artifacts from the town's history.

With the Statewide Grant, the museum plans to buy a new computer to house a digital photo archive with hopes to buy a printer in the future.

This photo from the Genoa Historical Museum archives is the Genoa Catholic Church, built outside the Genoa Indian School. The purpose of this school was to give Native American schoolchildren a religious education.
