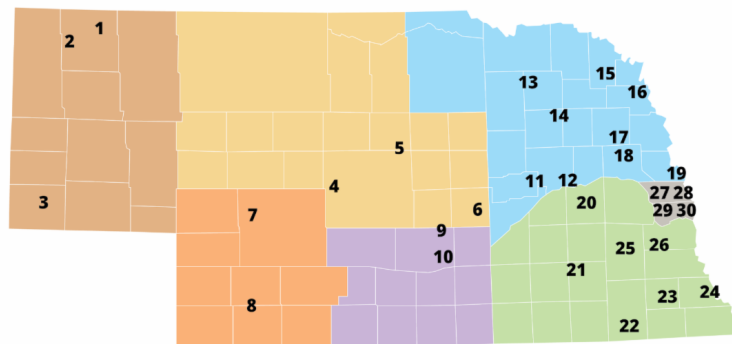

The Nebraska State Historical Society Foundation received 88 applications for the 2022 Statewide Grants Program. These applicants requested over \$147,000 in grant funding and the Foundation was able to award \$25,000 to the final 30 winners. Sites receiving grant funding for the 2022 cycle will use their grant for new exhibits, internships, preservation materials, technology upgrades, and other deserving projects. ## Learn more about Alkali Station!



Trustee Bruce Rippeteau tells the story of his involvement with the Nebraska State Historical Society Foundation and why Alkali Station needs to be preserved for future generations. Bruce is a retired Archaeologist and Prehistorian: first at the SUNY, then he was the first State Archaeologist of Colorado. Later he was a vice president of the oil and gas exploration company Powers Elevation (later Petroleum Information Corporation), and then became the Director of the large South Carolina Institute of Archaeology (a regulatory state agency; with Institute research on the Spanish Colonial Capitol of Santa Elena and the Civil War Submarine *Hunley*).
