

ONLY DAYS LEFT TO SAVE THE PERSHING MURAL!

All <u>Give To Lincoln donations</u> to the Nebraska State Historical Society Foundation will go towards saving the Pershing Mural. We only have until May 31st to raise the \$262,077 needed to meet the \$800,000 initial goal. When the Committee meets the initial goal of \$800,000, \$200,000 in contingent commitments will then enable the Committee to meet the \$1 million dollar goal allowing removal of the mural.

One million would allow the safe removal of the Mural before the building is roped off for its scheduled demolition late summer. The Committee would then have additional time to continue their fundraising and grant-writing efforts to raise the additional \$2 million to restore and reinstall the mural at one of several locations we are exploring throughout Lincoln.
