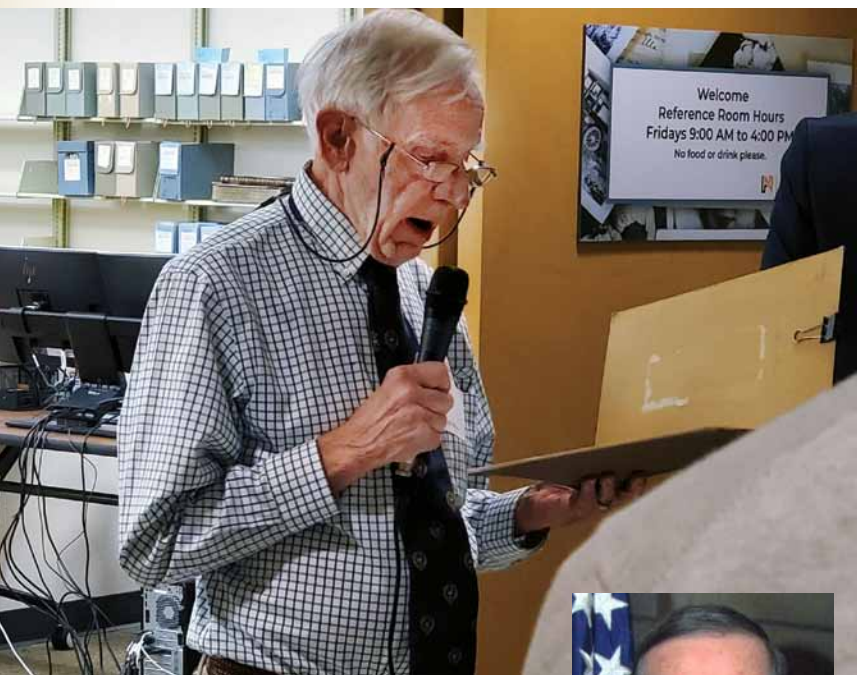

The Statewide Grants Program

This program makes available grants benefitting local historical and educational organizations providing programming and learning opportunities in community history. Examples of applying organizations include museums, historical societies, and libraries that use core educational, preservation and interpretive programs.

In January of 2021, the Foundation launched its first grant cycle for the Statewide Grants

The Nebraska Jewish Historical Society, a 2022 Statewide Grants Winner was awarded \$1,000 for digitizing multimedia segments of their collections.

Program. In all, 98 applications were received requesting \$359,561 in funding for projects across the State of Nebraska. \$15,605 was granted to 20 organizations in 18 counties in the inaugural award cycle. In 2022, 83 applications were received requesting \$147,845. \$25,000 was granted to 30 organizations in 26 counties.

Our goal is to raise a \$1 million dollar endowment to continue our efforts in supporting local historical organizations. Trustees Margaret Berry, Bob Puschendorf, Mike Smith and Trixie Schmidt reviewed the applications and chose the winners. We thank them for their meaningful work.



WanderNebraska

In 2022, in addition to the Grants program, the NSHSF has launched a statewide travel adventure program that encourages travelers to visit Nebraska museums, parks, libraries, historical sites and other points of interest in order to win participation prizes along the way. The WanderNebraska project is a mini-tourism initiative to further support the local sites through encouraging new visitors, new members and gift shop purchases.

Created and managed by NSHSF, the program will help accomplish an additional opportunity for media exposure and increased tourism. Twenty-seven sites all over Nebraska participated, including the 20 sites that were awarded grants in 2021. We want to thank our sponsors the Nebraska Lottery and the Omaha Storm Chasers.

We Stayed



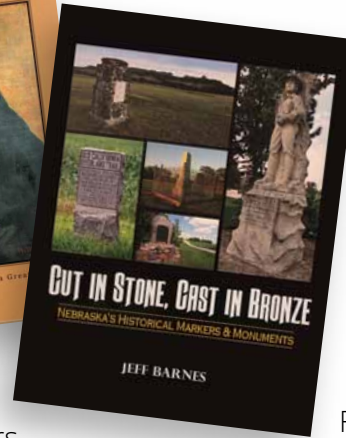
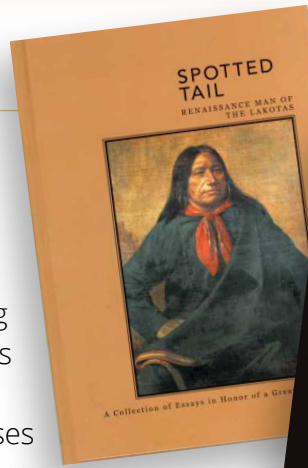
Dedicated in September of 2021, *We Stayed* is the first artistic installation the NSHS Foundation has received through the generosity of philanthropist Rhonda Seacrest, a Nebraskan whose vision will continue to inform and educate. The story of *We Stayed* will be told and retold in the years to come. The sculptures, now displayed in an outdoor setting at The Great Platte River Road Archway in Kearney, tell the story of Anton, Anna, Joseph, Elizabeth and Ester and their challenges of making a new life on the Plains.

Publications

Working with the Museum of the Fur Trade and through the generosity of the Ron and Judy Parks Publishing Fund, the Foundation was able to provide a portion of the publication expenses for *Spotted Tail: Renaissance Man of the Lakotas*. Spotted Tail is a collection of essays by renowned Western History writers detailing the life and death of Spotted Tail. The book was recently awarded a Silver Medal in the biography classification from the 2021



Independent Publisher Book Awards in New York City.

NSHSF Trustee Jeff Barnes' book, *Cut In Stone, Cast In Bronze: Nebraska's Historical Markers and Monuments 1854 - 1967*, published by the NSHS Foundation was selected by The Nebraska Center

for the Book as winner of the 2021 Nonfiction Nebraska as Place Award.



Alkali Station

Through the generosity of Nebraskans far and wide, the Foundation has raised \$120,000 toward the loan of \$250,000 on the 213.5-acre parcel in Keith County known as Alkali Station which consists of open, unplowed prairie that preserves the site of Alkali Station, a stop along the historic Oregon Trail and Pony Overland Express. As the site has not been excavated or placed into cultivated

agricultural use, it retains a high level of integrity. With the help of historians and archaeologists, we look forward to creating interpretation at the site and in August of

2022, an educational component for fourth graders will be available to all teachers as a free downloadable study and activity guide. We thank NSHSF Trustee Kylie Kinley for her work on this very special project.

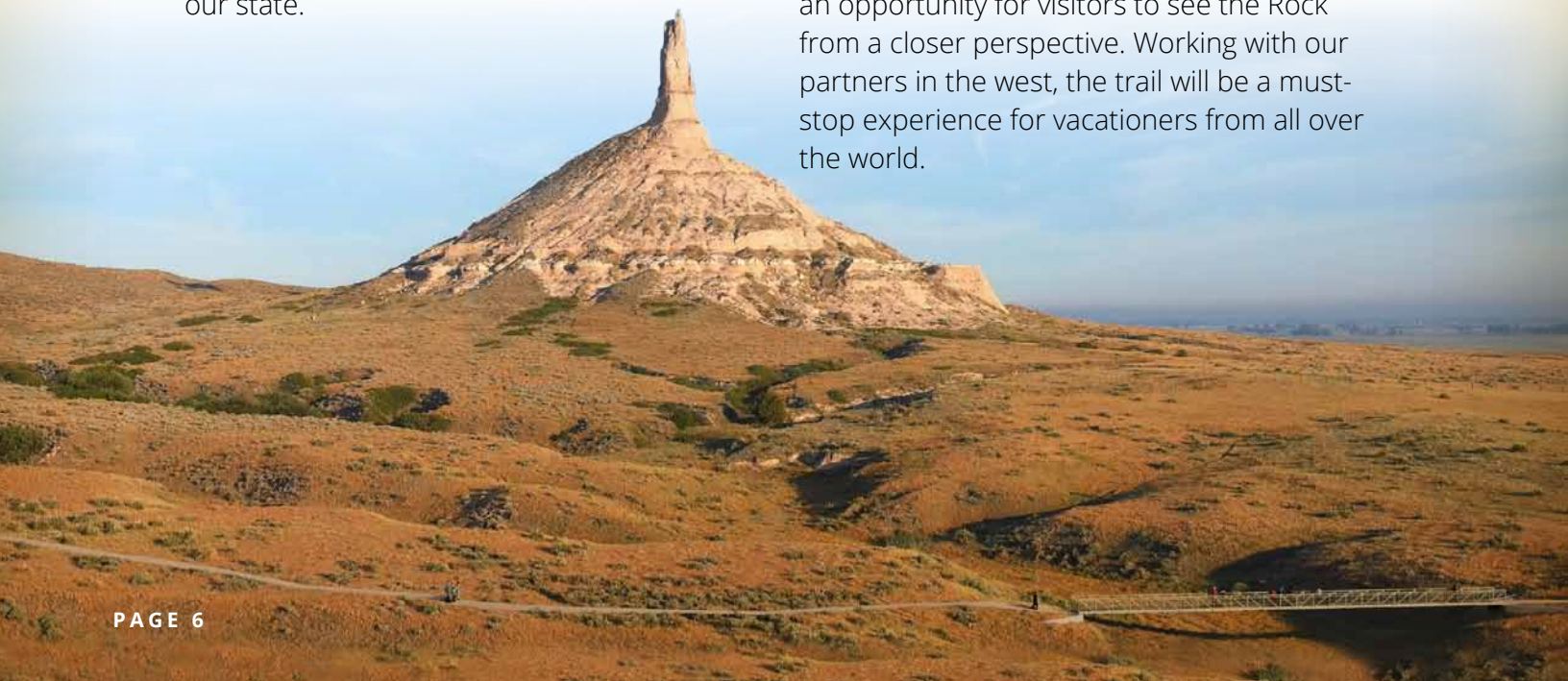
Since the fundraising campaign to **Save the Pershing Mural** was initiated on March 1, 2022, a small group of individuals organized by Liz Shea-McCoy and fiscal sponsor, Nebraska State Historical Society Foundation have worked vigorously raising over 800 private donations totaling more than \$840,000. Monetary commitments have been received from entities including the Acklie Charitable Foundation, Ameritas, Richard P. Kimmel and Laurine Kimmel Charitable Fund and the Krieger Foundations.



New Projects - 1942, It Was a Very Good Year

Walk to the Rock, has been selected by our Board of Directors as the inaugural "1942 Project"; a new initiative commemorating the Foundation's 80th anniversary. The "1942 Project" will be announced at the annual meeting and will be chosen as an example of the Foundation's mission and is reflective of our state.

The walking trail at the Chimney Rock National Historic Site will be situated on the southern portion of the Foundation's 360 acres of land, which was purchased in 2019 from the Howard family. Construction of the trail will begin in early 2023. We look forward to combining the story of our ancestors with an opportunity for visitors to see the Rock from a closer perspective. Working with our partners in the west, the trail will be a must-stop experience for vacationers from all over the world.



History Nebraska

Your Foundation continues to support History Nebraska through several endowments created by generous donors. In fiscal year 2021-2022, over \$260,000 was granted for many projects, among them funding for support for salaries for conservation assistants and the Paintings Conservator salary at the Gerald R. Ford Conservation Center, support



for the Nebraska History Museum's new permanent agricultural exhibit, for the William F. Cody and the Medal of Honor Marker located in Mullen, and for three digitization scanners. In the last twenty-five years, the Foundation has supported more than \$20 million in grants and transfers to the Nebraska State Historical Society.
