Rob Bozell spent over 40 years as an archeologist and much of that as the Nebraska State Archeologist. His professional interests include past subsistence practices, paleoclimate, fur trade era archeology, Indigenous archeology of the past two thousand years, and working with tribes on repatriation and historic preservation. He recently assisted the NSHS Foundation with an archeological assessment of O'Fallon's Bluff.

Dr. Carla Ketner has owned and managed Chapters Books & Gifts, an independent book, toy and gift store on the historic downtown Square in Seward, Nebraska, for eighteen years. She has taught undergraduate language arts and children's literature courses in the teacher education programs at Nebraska Wesleyan University, the University of Nebraska-Lincoln, and Concordia University-Seward. Carla supports History Nebraska's mission of passing along Nebraska's heritage to future generations and appreciates the opportunity to be personally involved with the Foundation.

Dan Worth is Principal Emeritus and Historical Architect with BCH Architecture. Dan has 45 years of experience with an emphasis in historical preservation, rehabilitation, urban design, master planning, programming and project management. Over his career has designed and implemented large and complex, historically significant projects with clients including the National Park Service, Smithsonian Institution, State of Nebraska, and Nebraska State College System.
