
Preserving and celebrating Nebraska's rich history

Over 170 museums, historical societies, historic state parks, and libraries with historical records and research opportunities are included on this easy-to-navigate website.

Travelers who visit the website can visit the "sites" page, type in a city, and find all museums in the location. Looking for something more broad? The Shelton Historical Society is on US Hwy 30 & C Street located in the historic 1909 Meisner Bank Building. The building is located along one block of the original Lincoln Highway bricks. The museum includes the history of the Lincoln Highway, including original highway markers, postcards and vintage memorabilia.
