The new library features a dedicated research room, primarily for genealogical work, according to Librarian Dorlissa Beyer. They now have a new computer and software to make records more searchable for patrons. The grand two-story entryway of the newly remodeled library is impressive and inviting, with a beautiful crystal chandelier.
