WanderNebraska Adventure Tours provide exciting opportunities for fans of Nebraska History to experience all-inclusive history-focused tours across the state, led by Dr. Sara Crook. Dr. Crook is a retired Professor Emeritus from Peru State College. The 2025 WanderNebraska Adventure Tours include three all-inclusive tours:

• <u>Pioneer Prairie</u> March 18th & 19th: this 2-day tour will make stops at places like the Mennonite Heritage Park, Stuhr Museum, Fort Kearny State Historical Park, and Crane Trust Nature Center as well as a behind the scenes tour of Museum of Nebraska Arts.

- <u>Wild West Frontier</u> June 9 through June 13th: this 5-day tour will cover the western part of the state with stops at Ash Hollow State Park, Chimney Rock, Fort Robinson, and Ole's Big Game Bar.
- Gateway to the Good Life August 20th & 21st: there will be stops at the John Philip Falter Museum, the Sage Museum, and the Kregel Windmill Museum.

All tours depart from Lincoln, NE, with the Wild West Frontier tour offering additional pick-up locations along I-80. Meals at local restaurants are included in the tour packages.

"We are so proud to sponsor this program again," said Leslie Fattig, Executive Director of NSHSF. "These tours provide a fantastic opportunity to explore Nebraska's historical treasures, and with Dr. Crook as the guide, participants are in for an unforgettable experience."
